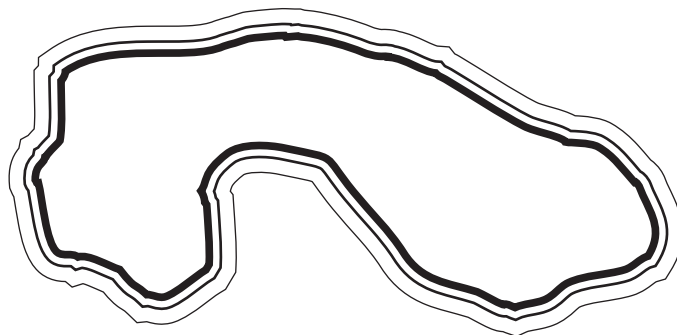




## ALERT BAY 360 RULES AND CONDITIONS

The 'Alert Bay 360' is one lap, circumnavigating Cormorant Island, in a clockwise direction, using a self propelled water vessel.



## REGISTRATION

Registration is FREE

The registration desk we will be accepting donations for the local Lions Club of Alert Bay.

1. All participants must pre-register before the Alert Bay 360 begins.
2. Final Registration will take place at the Alert Bay Municipal Wharf. 08:00 am - 10:30 am on July 24th, 2010.
3. The event is open to all ages, however, children or those regarded by the Canadian Coast Guard, R.C.M. P. or Alert Bay 360 organisers as unsafe or unfit may be disallowed.
4. All participants under the age of 15 must have the written permission of a legal guardian on registration form.
5. The Alert Bay 360 event starts at 11:00 am on July 24th at the Alert Bay Municipal Wharf.



## QUALIFICATION & PRIZES

1. Any self propelled vessel is eligible to enter, including kayak, canoe, rowing skiff etc. No wind, electric or gas powered propulsion is allowed.
2. One ticket will be issued to each registered finishing vessel, regardless of the number of persons in each vessel, for the random grand prize draws.
3. A random draw will be held at 3:00 p.m., all finishers are eligible to win: First Prize - Atlantis Kayak - WaV racing model - valued at \$4,000.00, Second Prize- Sam Johnson, Beaver mask, valued at \$2,500.00 donated by Gordon Peterson of Alert Bay, Third Prize- \$1,000.00 cash collected from community donations.
4. The first, second and third place finishers in both male and female categories will be awarded cash prizes. This category is restricted to single person vessels only. The first place male prize is \$1,000.00, second place male \$500.00, and third place male \$250.00. First place female \$1,000.00, second place female \$500.00, third place female \$250.00.
5. In addition to the top finisher cash prizes a prize table will be set up for participants to choose from according to their finish position. These prizes may include camping gear, native art, cash etc. and will be given out until all prizes have been chosen.



## SAFETY

1. All persons entering this event do so at their own risk, including any risk to equipment
2. Registration implies rules have been accepted.
3. All entrants must supply their own vessel, and safety equipment in accordance with Transport Canada Safe Boating Regulations.
4. Anyone deemed unfit to start by the Canadian Coast Guard, R.C.M.P. or Alert Bay 360 organisers will be automatically unregistered.

\*In the event there is a dispute between finishing times or placement the decision made by the Alert Bay 360 chairman will be final.
